All entrants are asked to have a prepared write-up/description of their float entry that can be used to introduce your float in the main ring. Please check in with one of the volunteers with registration cards, at the corner of George Street and Hwy 357, between 12 and 1 pm, to get your parade number and to give them your write-up on your entry. Judging will take place along the parade route.

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

All Exhibitors are subject to these Rules and Regulations in addition to those specifically listed in the separate categories.

PLEASE NOTE THE DEADLINE FOR YOUR ENTRY FORMS UNDER THE SPECIFIC CATEGORIES.

- The Exhibition Office will be open on Monday August 12th to Saturday August 17th from 7:00 am 9:00 pm. Please address all inquiries and correspondence to: Halifax County Exhibition, PO Box 161, Middle Musquodoboit NS BON 1X0 or email to halifaxcountyex@bellaliant.com
- 2. The Exhibition will be open to the public, from 9:00 am 10:00 pm all four days of the show.
- 3. CHILDREN'S DAY: All children 12 & under will be admitted free of charge on Wednesday, the first day of the Exhibition.
- **4.** Exhibitors, when they arrive with entries, should see the <u>Superintendent of their section</u> who will inform them where the exhibit/article are to be placed. Please refer to **individual sections for closing times of entries.**
- 5. Any concerns are to be made in writing to the Exhibition Office before the close of the show.
- 6. No person shall interfere with the Judges or attempt to influence a Judge's decision. Any person who uses any contemptuous or abusive language in reference to any award made shall forfeit his/her right to any premium which they might otherwise be entitled to and could be denied participation in future Exhibitions.
- 7. This is an Agricultural Exhibition and Exhibitors are reminded to be courteous to all other Exhibitors and to take the time to answer questions from the public passing through.
- 8. Judges are required to give their reasons on placing of classes when requested by the Superintendents.
- 9. Exhibits must remain in place (*including decorations) until 9:00 pm Saturday evening. Removing exhibits before this time will forfeit entry to future Exhibitions. *Livestock trailers will be given admittance to the Exhibition Grounds in accordance to a pre-determined schedule prior to 9 pm Saturday evening. See individual Livestock sections for more information.
- 10. Dogs are not permitted to be brought on the grounds by the general public. Service Dogs <u>are</u> allowed on grounds with the proper documentation and identification. Pets in Exhibitor Sleeping area must always remain in this area during the exhibition and on a leash. Please pick up after pets.
- 11. The Exhibitor is responsible for all expenses incurred in transporting entries and maintaining them during the show. The Exhibition Management Committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage. Any article left in the buildings or on the grounds after the close of the Exhibition shall be entirely at the owner's risk.
- 12. Limited Space is available camper parking for our livestock exhibitors' convenience. If you require space to park your camper trailer, please phone or email the Exhibition office for more information.

ATTENTION: Exhibitors of animals, machinery in motion, and other exhibits liable to occasional accidents, injury or damage to persons coming in contact with them shall guard their exhibits and protect the public from coming in contact therewith, and every such exhibitor does hereby indemnify the Halifax County Exhibition, the Middle Musquodoboit Agricultural Society and Officials from and against all such claims, demands, costs, charges and expenses which it may occur, suffer or be put to be reason of any accident, or of any period being injured or suffering damage through by reason of any such exhibit not being properly protected there from.

LIABILITY INSURANCE: We require that every large animal on our grounds, and each pull event participant, is covered for liability should that animal, exhibitor, or vehicle be involved in an incident on the Exhibition Grounds causing injury or harm to buildings or people. Your policy must show us that you, the animal or animals you are bringing onto the Exhibition Grounds, or your vehicles, have the proper coverage to be at the Halifax County Exhibition. If your coverage is part of a group plan, we require proof of the insurance as well as proof of your membership under this plan. Proof must clearly show the appropriate coverage. This proof of insurance must accompany the Exhibitors Entry Form and is a part of said entry form.

The Halifax County Exhibition and the Middle Musquodoboit Agricultural Society, its employees, agents or servants shall not be liable for any loss to an exhibitor, his or her employees, agents or servants which may have occasioned by fire, accident, condition of structure or the negligence of other exhibitors, officials or otherwise, howsoever.

HAND CRAFTS & HOME CRAFTS

RULES & REGULATIONS - In addition to the General Rules & Regulations:

- 1. Entries: To enter your articles for judging, please fill out an entry form at the back of this prize book for each article you want to enter, then bring the entry forms with you when you drop off your entries. Alternatively, you can fill out your entry forms at the Exhibition when you drop off your entries; there will be many blank forms available for your use and volunteers will be available to help you fill out this information if help is needed.
- 2. Completion of the entry tags will be the responsibility of the exhibitor.
- 3. There is no entry fee for the Hand and Home Crafts Competitions.
- 4. Hand Craft articles must be delivered between 2 pm and 4 pm on Sunday or 2pm and 8 pm on Monday prior to the Exhibition opening to the Crafts Superintendent/Volunteers at the Agricultural Education and Multipurpose Centre (Centre) on the Exhibition Grounds. Someone must accompany all entries to the Centre and have the entry form and tag information properly completed. Volunteers will be available to help you fill out this information if help is needed.
- 5. Home Craft articles must be delivered **between 2pm and 8 pm on Monday** prior to the Exhibition opening to the Crafts Superintendent/Volunteers at the Agricultural Education and Multipurpose Centre (Centre) on the Exhibition Grounds. Someone must accompany all entries to the Centre and have the entry form and tag information properly completed. Volunteers will be available to help you fill out this information if help is needed.
- 6. Judging takes place on Tuesday. The building will be opened for viewing on Wednesday during regular hours of the Exhibition.
- 7. Articles entered must be the bona fide work of the Exhibitor.
- **8.** Any articles deemed to be soiled or defaced will be removed before judging. Said articles may be obtained at the Main Office by Wednesday (opening day) by 9 pm. Should the article not be claimed, it will be disposed of.
- 9. Any article previously shown at the Halifax County Exhibition is not eligible for competition.
- 10. Sales of your exhibited article are supported and encouraged. If you are interested in selling your article(s), tell the Volunteers when you drop off your exhibits for entry and judging. A "for sale; inquire within" sign will be affixed to the article after judging.
- 11. Judges will not award a prize to any section in which the work is considered "below standard."
- 12. Exhibitors are requested to read the Prize List carefully as entries not conforming to the listed stipulation(s) will not be judged.
- 13. The Point System used for special prizes is 1st 4 pts, 2nd 3 pts, 3rd 2 pts, 4th 1 pt.
- 14. Exhibits must not be removed <u>prior to 9 pm</u> on Saturday, the last day of the show. Articles should be picked up by the Exhibitor between the hours of 9 pm and 10 pm, Saturday evening. Should it not be possible for the Exhibitor to pick up their own articles, please notify the Craft Superintendent as to who will pick up your entries. The Halifax County Exhibition will not be responsible for the articles not retrieved between the hours of 9 pm & 10 pm Saturday. The Exhibition Management Committee will dispose of all items not retrieved.
- 15. All Prize Money & Special Prizes must be picked up by 9:00 pm on Saturday in the Main Office. Any money not collected (or had special arrangements made for later collection) by this time will be donated back to the Halifax County Exhibition.
- **16.** Articles entered in the Sections **M1 4 & M6** must be visible on the reverse side for judging. Failure to do so will deem the article ineligible for judging.
- 17. Exhibitors are encouraged to keep all their exhibits on display.
- **18.** The Management will take reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of articles entered yet it must be understood that the owners themselves must assume all risk. Should any article be accidentally injured, lost or stolen, while the Management will give all assistance in its power towards the recovery of the same, it will not make any payment for the value thereof.
- 19. Only one exhibit in any one class will be accepted from any one exhibitor.
- 20. Work must have been completed within the past year August 2023 August 2024.
